## Disease Information for Montana

### Summary of MMWR Week 25: Ending 6/22/2019

- **General Communicable Diseases:** Elevated blood lead (1)
- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (7), Coccidioidomycosis (1), Cryptosporidiosis (2), Salmonellosis (1), Varicella (Chickenpox) (1)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** Influenza hospitalization (1), Pertussis (13), *Streptococcus pneumoniae*, invasive (1)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (60), Gonorrhea (21), Syphilis (2)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis C, acute (1), Hepatitis C, chronic (15)
- **Zoonotic diseases:** (0)
- **Animal Rabies:** (1)

**Pertussis:** To date in 2019, 376 cases of pertussis have been reported in Montana, which compares to 30 cases at the same time in 2018. The cluster of Blaine county pertussis cases has grown to eleven – public health investigations are continuing.

**Measles:** So far in 2019, 1,077 measles cases have been reported from 28 states, an increase of 33 cases since the week prior. There are no measles cases in Montana. Please collect a respiratory specimen for PCR testing (throat, NP or nasal Dacron swab in viral transport media) if you would like to test for measles. Prompt reporting of suspect measles cases is essential!

**STD/HIV program update:** During the week ending 6/22/19, 60 cases of chlamydia (CT) and 21 cases of gonorrhea (GC) were reported. Case counts for chlamydia and gonorrhea decreased across the state and 52% of GC cases were reported from Yellowstone County. One secondary cases of syphilis reported that week. One new case of HIV was reported this week bringing the total to 14 YTD compared to 13 during the same time last year. Missoula County has had 6 of the 14 new HIV diagnoses this year.
