### Summary of MMWR Week 28: Ending 7/13/2019

- **General Communicable Diseases:** Elevated blood lead (1)
- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (17), Cryptosporidiosis (2), Giardiasis (1), Salmonellosis (5), Shiga toxin producing *E. coli* [STEC] (3)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** *Haemophilus influenzae* invasive (1), Pertussis (16), *Streptococcus pneumoniae* (1), Varicella [chickenpox] (1), Hepatitis B chronic (1), *Streptococcus pneumoniae*, invasive (1)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (91), Gonorrhea (45), Primary/Secondary Syphilis (1), HIV (0)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis C, Acute (1) chronic (22)
- **Zoonotic diseases:** Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever (1)

**Measles:** As of July 11, 1,123 measles cases have been reported from 28 states, an increase of 14 cases from the previous week. There are no measles cases in Montana at this time. This week, the Washington State Department of Health expanded their notification of a potential measles exposures based on newly identified cases at Seattle Children's Hospital. Exposures to this individual may have occurred between 7/8/19 and 7/11/19. Visit the [King County Health Department website](#) for more information.

**Rabies:** At the end of week 28, 64 rabies post-exposure prophylaxis recommendations and/or administrations have been recorded for 2019. This compares to 106 reports during the same period in 2018. Three rabid bats have been reported in 2019 (one occurred in week 29).
