Disease Information for Montana

Summary of MMWR Week 26: Ending 6/29/2019

- **General Communicable Diseases:** Coccidioimycosis (1), Elevated blood lead (1)
- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (9), Cryptosporidiosis (1), Giardiasis (1), Salmonellosis (1),
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** *Haemophilus influenzae* [nontypeable], Pertussis (6), *Streptococcus pneumoniae* (1)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (93), Gonorrhea (37), Syphilis [latent] (2), HIV (0)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis C, chronic (18)
- **Zoonotic diseases:** (0)
- **Animal Rabies:** (0), Rabies PEP (6)

Rabies: Through week 26, 50 rabies post-exposure prophylaxis recommendations and/or administrations have been reported for 2019. This compares to 74 recommendations and/or administrations from the same time period in 2018, which is a 32% reduction in rabies PEP reports year to date from the previous year.

Two rabid bats have been reported in 2019. One was located in Lewis and Clark, and the other was from Missoula. Both were tested due to animal exposure, and no human exposure was reported with either bat.

Pertussis: To date in 2019, 393 cases of pertussis have been reported in Montana, which compares to 30 cases at the same time in 2018. Missoula County added a few extra cases of the past two weeks. A newly identified cluster of cases was reported from Yellowstone County this week – public health investigations are continuing. In addition, an isolated case was identified in Beaverhead County.

Measles: As of June 27, 1,095 measles cases have been reported from 28 states, an increase of 18 cases from the previous week. There are no measles cases in Montana. The Washington State Department of Health notified public health agencies of a potential measles exposure to a newly identified case at Seattle Children's Hospital. Exposures to this individual may have occurred on 6/23 and 6/26. *To date, no Montana residents have been notified of this exposure.*
