### Summary of MMWR Week 30: Ending 7/27/2019

- **General Communicable Diseases:** Elevated blood lead (2), Legionellosis (1)
- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (12), Cryptosporidiosis (1), Salmonellosis (4), Shiga toxin producing *E. coli* [STEC] (2)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** Influenza hospitalization (0), Pertussis (1), Streptococcus pneumoniae (2), Varicella [chickenpox] (1)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (102), Gonorrhea (35), Syphilis (1), HIV (0)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis C, chronic (2)
- **Zoonotic diseases:** (0)
- **Animal Rabies:** (0)

**West Nile Virus:** We continue to monitor for cases of WNV, however, there have been no human or equine cases reported yet this year. Last year, at this same time, we had one case of WNV reported in a human. As of week six for mosquito trapping, a total of 26 counties have submitted at least one mosquito specimen for testing. The following states have reported human cases of WNV: Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Iowa, Kentucky, Maryland, Missouri, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Virginia, and Wyoming.

**Pertussis:** This week Missoula City-County Health Department (MCCHD) released a local HAN to inform partners that community-wide pertussis transmission continues in Missoula County. To date, 417 pertussis cases have been reported in Montana, with 159 of those reported from Missoula County. MCCHD is still receiving reports of new cases, with 9 new cases in the month of July.

As we are approaching the beginning of the 2019-2020 school year, please be aware of suspect cases of pertussis. In addition, as a majority of recent cases have a history of pertussis containing vaccine, keep in mind that vaccinated individuals will present with milder symptoms.
