Summary of MMWR Week 40: Ending 10/5/2019

- **General Communicable Diseases:** Elevated blood lead (0)
- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (8), Cryptosporidiosis (1), Giardiasis (1), Salmonellosis (7), Shiga toxin producing *E. coli* [STEC] (0)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** Influenza hospitalization (1), Pertussis (0), Streptococcus pneumoniae (0), Varicella [chickenpox] (1)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (105), Gonorrhea (35), Syphilis (4), HIV (2)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis C, chronic (32)

Influenza: Sporadic influenza activity has been reported in a few counties over the past few weeks and has decreased a bit during the first week of flu reporting. Flu surveillance season began on October 1; please remember to get your MIDIS flu case counts in by Wednesday of each week.

Recent vaccination clinic protests: Flathead County notified CDEpi regarding a limited number of anti-vaccination protesters who were present at a recent flu vaccine clinic. Fortunately, the impact was small, and a record number of flu immunizations were given that day. We wanted to make you aware of the possibility of similar events popping up in your community.
