### Summary of State Diseases for MMWR Week 3: Ending 1/18/2020

- **General Communicable Diseases:** Elevated blood lead (4)
- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (2), Coccidioidomycosis (1), Cryptosporidiosis (3), Giardiasis (1), Salmonellosis (1)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** Influenza hospitalization (18), Pertussis (5), *Streptococcus pneumoniae* (1), Varicella [chickenpox] (2)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (93), Gonorrhea (26), Syphilis, latent (2), Syphilis, primary or secondary (1), HIV (1)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis C, chronic (20)
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**Novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV):** CDC continues to monitor an ongoing outbreak of a novel coronavirus that is associated with the Wuhan City, China area. Nearly 600 cases including 17 deaths have been reported from several countries, including China, Japan, Thailand, South Korea, and the United States. Preliminary information from the [World Health Organization \(WHO\)](http://www.who.int) suggests that human-to-human transmission is occurring and a preliminary basic reproductive number (R0) estimate of 1.4-2.5 was presented (to compare, the R0 of measles is 12-18). The source is still unknown and the extent of human-to-human transmission is still not clear.
