Summary of State Diseases for MMWR Week 2: Ending 1/11/2020

- **General Communicable Diseases:** Elevated blood lead (1)
- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (4), Cryptosporidiosis (1), Salmonellosis (2)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** *Haemophilus influenzae*, invasive (1), Influenza hospitalization (24), Pertussis (1), *Streptococcus pneumoniae* (6), Varicella (1)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (94), Gonorrhea (44), HIV (1)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis A, acute (1), Hepatitis B, chronic (1), Hepatitis C, chronic (29), Hepatitis C, acute (2)

Influenza: Influenza B continues to be the predominant strain both in Montana and in the U.S., although influenza A cases are catching up. Last week, 51% of strains typed by laboratories across the state were influenza B, compared to 70% in the previous four weeks. This week, DPHHS CDEpi released a [HAN message](#) to share recent CDC updates for clinicians regarding influenza B surveillance, including antiviral treatment and vaccination. To date, Montana influenza data reflects what is expected for this time in the season and we are likely nearing peak influenza activity.
