Summary of State Diseases for MMWR Week : Ending 2/1/2020

- **General Communicable Diseases:** Elevated blood lead (1)
- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (4), Cryptosporidiosis (1), Listeriosis (1), Salmonellosis (1), Shiga toxin-producing E. coli (*STEC*) (1), Shigellosis (1)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** Influenza hospitalization (30), Pertussis (1), *Streptococcus pneumoniae*, invasive (1)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (82), Gonorrhea (27), Syphilis, unknown (1)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis A, acute (1), Hepatitis B, chronic (1), Hepatitis C, chronic (22)
- **Latent TB Infection:** (4)

Influenza: Flu activity continues to increase in Montana over the past few weeks with a fairly large increase in cases reported. To date, 4033 cases, 186 hospitalizations, and four deaths have been reported. At least one case of influenza has been reported from every health jurisdiction in the state. Influenza B continues to predominate but the proportion of influenza A has been increasing over the past two weeks. Hospitalization rates for the youngest (age 0-4 years) and oldest (age >65 years) Montanans remain the highest.
