Summary of State Diseases for MMWR Week 4: Ending 1/25/2020

- **General Communicable Diseases:** Elevated blood lead (4)
- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (2), Cryptosporidiosis (1), Giardiasis (1), Salmonellosis (1), Shigellosis (1)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** *Haemophilus influenzae*, invasive (1), Influenza hospitalization (26), Malaria (1), Pertussis (3), *Streptococcus pneumoniae* (2), Varicella [chickenpox] (1)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (89), Gonorrhea (37), Syphilis, latent (2), Syphilis, primary or secondary (2)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis B, chronic (1), Hepatitis C, acute (1) Hepatitis C, chronic (20)

Influenza: Flu activity continues to increase in Montana with a fairly large increase in cases reported. To date, 3042 cases, 148 hospitalizations, and one death have been reported. At least one case has been reported from every health jurisdiction in the state. Influenza B continues to predominate but the proportion of influenza A positives is rising (currently at 44.6%).

STD/HIV program update: During the week ending 1/25/20, 89 cases of chlamydia (CT) and 37 cases of gonorrhea (GC) were reported. Chlamydia cases slightly decreased from the previous week while gonorrhea cases increased from last week. Cascade and Yellowstone counties reported 59% of all GC cases. Two primary syphilis cases from Cascade count were reported this week. There have been two newly diagnosed cases of HIV year-to-date.
