#### Gallatin County COVID-19 Update

As of Friday, April 3, 2020, at 4:55 p.m. Gallatin County has a total of 101 confirmed cases of COVID-19. Of those cases, 1 patient in the county is hospitalized.

All Gallatin County cases consist of community transmission, close contact, and travel related history.

As the weekend approaches many Gallatin County residents may be seeking fresh air and sunshine. While this activity is allowed under Governor Bullock's Stay at Home order, it's important to strictly maintain physical distance even while outside.

- **The number one priority is the health of others.** COVID-19 exposure is life or death for many. Respect people you bump into by practicing social distancing. Wave hello, smile, be kind, and maintain a six-foot distance.
- **You can go outside – but be thoughtful.** Avoid gatherings, practice good hand hygiene, and stay home if you're sick. We all need to avoid spreading illness.
- **Stay close to home.** This limits your exposure to the virus and stops its spread. A simple walk around the block or to a neighborhood park is better than driving an hour away.
- **Keep it chill.** Healthcare, rescue and emergency response systems are working hard already. In order to avoid placing first responders at greater risk, think twice before doing any high-risk activities.
- **Respect closures and be a good public steward.** Many public areas may be closed, so check online beforehand. Although inconvenient, closures are for the greater good and prevent the spread of illness.
