Gallatin County COVID-19 Update

As of Friday, June 5, 2020, at 12 p.m. Gallatin County has no new confirmed cases of COVID-19, for a cumulative total of 163. There are 11 confirmed active cases. There have been a total of 151 people recovered in Gallatin County. One person has died from COVID-19 complications.

Active cases of COVID-19 are located in various locations across Gallatin County.

The Gallatin City-County Board of Health will meet on Tuesday, June 9 to consider changes to local public health rule in order to continue phased re-opening of bars and restaurants in a manner consistent with statewide directives from Gov. Steve Bullock.

The proposed rule would allow bars, restaurants, breweries, distilleries and casinos to stay open one hour later, until 12:30 am. The rule would also allow limited seating at bars, with restrictions intended to limit contact with serving areas and bartenders or staff.

"The only changes being proposed to the local rule would be to make the local rule consistent with the governor's directives issued earlier this week," said Matt Kelley, Health Officer for Gallatin City-County Health Department. "The intention is to keep our local rule on pace with the statewide reopening rules."

Kelley noted that the local board does not have discretion to make its rule less stringent than the governor's directive. "It's a fairly minor change, but one we need to make in order to be consistent," Kelley said.

The meeting will take place at the Gallatin County Courthouse Community Room, 311 W. Main St. in downtown Bozeman. The meeting will begin at 7 a.m. and be streamed online [here](#).
