Summary of MMWR Week 46 for the state of Montana

- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (6), Giardiasis (1), Salmonellosis (1), Shiga toxin-producing *Escherichia coli* (STEC) (1), Shigellosis (1)
- **General Communicable Diseases:** Coccidioidomycosis (1), Latent TB Infection (LTBI) (2), Metal exposure, mercury (1)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis B, chronic (2), Hepatitis C, acute (12), Hepatitis C, chronic (36)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (77), Gonorrhea (21), Syphilis, primary or secondary (2)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** *Streptococcus pneumoniae*, invasive (5), *Haemophilus influenzae*, invasive (1)
- **Zoonotic Diseases:** Rabies, post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) (2)

Influenza: Weekly Flu Data - Week 46

- Influenza A tests run: 1376
 - **4 positives** (All Influenza A/H3)
- Influenza B tests run: 1376
 - No positives
- Total confirmed influenza cases in MT: **11**, all H3N2
 - Flathead County: 1 case
 - Gallatin County: 8 cases
 - Hill County: 1 case
 - Jefferson County: 1 case
- Percentage of outpatient and ED visits for ILI in MT: 2.34%
 - National ILI visits: 2.14%; National baseline: 2.50%
- RSV tests run: 303
 - 101 positive tests were reported (**33.3%** positivity rate)

In Gallatin County, flu specimens no longer need to be sent to the MTPHL for confirmatory testing. Positive rapid and PCR flu tests must be reported to the GCCHD through this link:
