Summary of MMWR Week 4 for the state of Montana:

- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (1), Giardiasis (2), Cryptosporidiosis (1), Salmonellosis (1), Legionellosis (1)
- **General Communicable Diseases:** Elevated blood lead (3), Metal Exposure, Arsenic (1), Latent TB Infection (2)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis C, chronic (13)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (54), Gonorrhea (23), Syphilis, primary or secondary (6), Syphilis, latent (2)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** Influenza, hospitalization or death (6), Streptococcus pneumoniae, invasive (2)
- **Zoonotic Diseases:** Rabies, post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) (6)

Omicron Variant: As of February 1, there have been 1,021 cases in Montana infected with the Omicron variant, detected in most of Montana's local and tribal health jurisdictions. Last week, 48/48 (100%) specimens that were collected and sequenced were Omicron.

COVID 19: Montana is reporting 250,029 cases of COVID-19 as of 10:00 AM 2/4/2022. Of these, 11,161 individuals have been hospitalized and 3,031 have died. To date, Montana is reporting 1,383,070 total vaccine doses administered and processed into imMTrax. The total number of fully vaccinated persons is now 549,882. The percent of the eligible population that is fully vaccinated is 54%.

Influenza Update: Influenza activity has decreased statewide during week 4 of 2022, with 164 new cases reported. To date, 2876 cases, 80 hospitalizations, and one death have been associated with influenza in the state. Influenza A has been the dominant subtype circulating in Montana, with minimal Influenza B activity reported but present. In Gallatin County, flu cases have decreased similarly to the state. There have been 635 flu cases reported in Gallatin County (617 Flu A, 18 Flu B) since October 2021.
