Summary of MMWR Week 9 for the state of Montana:

- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (10), Cryptosporidiosis (3), Shiga toxin producing *Escherichia coli* (STEC) (1)
- **General Communicable Diseases:** Coccidioidomycosis (1), Latent TB infection (LTBI) (2),
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis B, chronic (2), Hepatitis C, chronic (32)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (87), Gonorrhea (26), Syphilis, primary or secondary (1)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** *Haemophilus influenzae*, invasive (1), Influenza, hospitalization or death (5), *Streptococcus pneumoniae*, invasive (2)
- **Zoonotic Diseases:** Rabies, post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) (2)

COVID-19: To date, over 79 million cases of COVID-19, including at least 966,575 deaths, have been reported in the U.S. The percent of the eligible U.S. population 5+ with at least one vaccination is 81.6%. Montana is reporting 272,105 cases of COVID-19 as of 10:30 AM 3/18/2022. Of these, 11,797 individuals have been hospitalized and 3,234 have died. To date, Montana is reporting 1,415,533 total vaccine doses administered and processed into imMTrax. The total number of fully vaccinated persons is now 558,561. The percent of the eligible population that is fully vaccinated is 55%.

Influenza: Influenza activity **decreased** statewide from March 06 – 12, 2022, with 192 new cases reported during week 10. Season to date, 4363 cases, 134 hospitalizations, and four deaths have been associated with influenza. Influenza A(H3) has been the dominant subtype circulating in Montana, with minimal Influenza B activity reported but present. Influenza-like illness (ILI) **increased** to 2.05%. RSV activity decreased again to 1.86% during week 10.
