Summary of MMWR Week 11 for the state of Montana:

- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (1), Cryptosporidiosis (1), Shiga toxin producing *Escherichia coli* (STEC) (1), Salmonellosis (1)
- **General Communicable Diseases:** Coccidioidomycosis (1), Latent TB infection (LTBI) (3), Elevated blood lead (1)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis C, chronic (20)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (77), Gonorrhea (24), Syphilis, primary or secondary (1)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** Influenza, hospitalization or death (9), *Streptococcus pneumoniae*, invasive (2), Varicella (1)
- **Zoonotic Diseases:** Rabies, post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) (1)

COVID-19: To date, over 79 million cases of COVID-19, including at least 972,550 deaths, have been reported in the U.S. The percent of the eligible U.S. population 5+ with at least one vaccination is 81.7%. Montana is reporting 272,397 cases of COVID-19 as of 11:19 AM 3/25/2022. Of these, 11,813 individuals have been hospitalized and 3,242 have died. To date, Montana is reporting 1,418,403 total vaccine doses administered and processed into imMTrax. The total number of fully vaccinated persons is now 559,474. The percent of the eligible population that is fully vaccinated is 55%.

Influenza: Influenza activity **increased** statewide from March 13 – 19, 2022, with 227 new cases reported during week 11. Season to date, 4590 cases, 144 hospitalizations, and four deaths have been associated with influenza. Influenza A has been the dominant subtype circulating in Montana, with minimal Influenza B activity reported but present. Influenza-like illness (ILI) **decreased** to 1.46%. RSV activity has stayed seasonally low after peaking early. During week 11, percent positivity was 1.16%.
