Summary of MMWR Week 13 for the state of Montana:

- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (2), Vibriosis (1)
- **General Communicable Diseases:** Elevated blood lead (3), Latent TB infection (LTBI) (4)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis B, chronic (3), Hepatitis C, chronic (15)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (93), Gonorrhea (27), Syphilis, primary or secondary (5), HIV/AIDS (1)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** Influenza hospitalization or death (18), *Streptococcus pneumoniae*, invasive (3), Varicella (1)
- **Vector Borne Diseases:** Q fever, acute (1)

BA.2 Variant Update: DPHHS is monitoring sublineages of the Omicron variant, including BA.2. As of April 5, there have been 3,652 cases across Montana infected with Omicron variants—3,627 infected with BA.1/B.1.1.529 and 25 infected with BA.2.

COVID-19: Montana is reporting 272,849 cases of COVID-19 as of 10:15 AM 04/08/2022. Of these, 11,846 individuals have been hospitalized and 3,255 have died. For more details, check out our weekly COVID report. To date, Montana is reporting 1,429,690 total vaccine doses administered and processed into imMTrax. The total number of fully vaccinated persons is now 560,890. The percent of the eligible population that is fully vaccinated is 55%.

Influenza Week 13 Summary: Influenza activity decreased statewide from March 27 – April 02, 2022, with 190 new cases reported during week 13. Some jurisdictions experienced an increase in case counts. Despite the overall decrease in cases, hospitalizations increased, primarily in individuals over 65 years old.

- Season to date, 5141 cases, 171 hospitalizations, and four deaths have been associated with influenza.
- Influenza A has been the dominant subtype circulating in Montana, with minimal Influenza B activity reported but present.
- Influenza-like illness (ILI) decreased to 1.44%.
- RSV activity has remained minimal after peaking early. During week 13, percent positivity was 1.08%.
