### Summary of MMWR Week 15 for the state of Montana:

- **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (5), Salmonellosis (3), Cryptosporidiosis (2), Shiga toxin producing *Escherichia coli* [STEC] (3), Shigellosis (2)
- **General Communicable Diseases:** Latent TB infection (LTBI) (3), Elevated Blood Lead (1), Metal Exposure, Mercury (1)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis B, chronic (4), Hepatitis C, acute (1), Hepatitis C, chronic (17)
- **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (81), Gonorrhea (18), Syphilis, primary or secondary (7)
- **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** Influenza hospitalization or death (5), *Streptococcus pneumoniae*, invasive (3)
- **Zoonotic diseases:** Rabies, animal (1), Rabies, PEP (16)

**BA.2 Variant Update:** DPHHS is monitoring sublineages of the Omicron variant, including BA.2. As of April 19, there have been 3,932 cases across Montana infected with Omicron variants—3,897 (99%) infected with BA.1/B.1.1.529 and 35 (1%) infected with BA.2.

**Influenza Week 15 Summary:** Influenza activity increased slightly statewide from April 10 – 16, 2022, with 176 new cases reported during week 15. Season to date: 5527 cases, 189 hospitalizations, and 8 deaths have been associated with influenza. Two additional influenza-associated deaths were reported during week 15. Influenza A has been the dominant subtype circulating in Montana, with minimal Influenza B activity reported but present. Influenza-like illness (ILI) increased to 1.41%. RSV activity fell to 0% during week 15.
