







Gallatin County Weekly Communicable Disease Report

- Additional summary of diseases reported in the state of Montana for MMWR Week 27:
 - **Enteric Diseases:** Campylobacteriosis (14), Cyclosporiasis (1), Giardiasis (1), Salmonellosis (2), Shiga toxin-producing *Escherichia coli* (STEC) (5)
 - **General Communicable Diseases:** COVID-19 (129), Latent TB Infection (LTBI) (2)
 - **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis C, chronic (18)
 - **STD/HIV:** Chlamydia (52), Gonorrhea (7), Syphilis, congenital (1), Syphilis, primary or secondary (5), Syphilis, latent (6)
 - **Vaccine Preventable Diseases:** *Haemophilus influenzae*, invasive (1), Pertussis (1), *Streptococcus pneumoniae*, invasive (4)
 - **Vector-Borne Diseases:** Lyme disease (3)*
 - **Zoonoses:** Rabies, post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) (3)
- **West Nile Virus Update:** The state of Montana has started testing mosquito pools for West Nile Virus. So far, there have been no detections, but other states near Montana have detected West Nile Virus in their mosquito pools.
